2014 SOLAS, MARPOL Amendments Enter Into Force

A number of amendments to the International Convention for the Safety of Life at Sea (SOLAS), the International Convention for the Prevention of Pollution from Ships (MARPOL) and the 1988 Load Lines Protocol entered into force or took effect from 1 January 2014.

The amendments cover:

- passenger ship safety (in relation to safe return to port after a flooding casualty);
- the testing of free-fall lifeboats; minimum safe manning levels;
- -prohibition of blending onboard;
- the revised MARPOL Annex III;
- -the United States Caribbean Sea Emission Control Area; and
- the Winter Seasonal Zone off the southern tip of Africa.

	United States Virgin Islands.	
	The ECA was designated under MARPOL amendments	
	adopted in July 2011. There are now four three	
	designated ECAs in effect globally: the United States	
	Caribbean Sea ECA and the North American ECA; and	
	the sulphur oxide ECAs in the Baltic Sea area and the	
	North Sea area.
